PROJECT INFORMATION

SIERY is a five-year project, funded by the European Union. The project aims to strengthen sub-national authorities in Yemen for better service provision and to improve local business environments For local economic development and job creation. The project consists of 2 components: 1- institutional resilience, which caters to improved basic service delivery and considers that the role of local authorities can play in stability, recovery and peace. 2- economic resilience which aims to improve local business environments for economy recovery and employment opportunities.

SIERY FIVE KEY OUTPUTS

- 1-Strengthened Local Authorities' capacities to respond to community needs for services in an inclusive and accountable manner.
- 2-Improved capacities of public services providers for scaling up the outreach to the most vulnerable.
- 3-Strengthened central-local and horizontal relations between local governance stakeholders.
- 4-Strengthened linkages/cooperation opportunities between MSMEs, private sector and MFIs involved in the value chains.
- 5-Increased and de-risked access to financial services for economic agents in promising value chains.

IMPACT SO FAR 1



439 DCT members representing local authorities from 45 districts.



110 DFT members trained in participatory planning, budgeting, tendering and project implementation



36 schools rehabilitated benefiting 40000 students (focus on girls)



36 schools provided with solar energy systems



45 districts have selected the nominees for Community Networks



35 districts have completed district-level capacity assessments and developed DCD plans



68 LED ambassadors trained in local economic development



70 women capacitated on local governance & Public Expenditure Management in Marib



11 officials from executive offices in Marib participated in an experience exchange visit to Rwanda



Completion of technical assessment for 4 targeted central markets



45 coffee cuppers have been trained and 8 of them have the coffee cupping certification in Amman



600 women livestock breeders received grants, including equipping, restoring and barns buildings



88 women livestock breeders received 5 sheep/goats for each women



4 value chain studies have been finalized (Dates, Finish, henna and wheat)

45 locally prioritized projects completed benefiting 2+ million people



45 districts in 9 governorates have produced their development plans for 2022 and 2023



552 education personnel(171 women & 381 men) trained on crisis management in 23 districts



348 educational staff and school managers trained on Back-to-School for enrolment campaign (97 women, 251 men)



180 school staff participated in risk management framework development & 203 other trained in educational planning



100 local authorities trained in school safety, risk mitigation and management and emergency plan preparation



2,257 smallholder producers capacitated in technical & business skills



551 SMEs trained in business continuity management, while 260 have received partial grants



1.406 smallholders received grants



30 representatives of 30 CSOs trained in social accountability initiatives



259 members of **Community Structures** participated in training on community participatory planning



110 DFT's members capacitated on gender and youth sensitivity approaches
