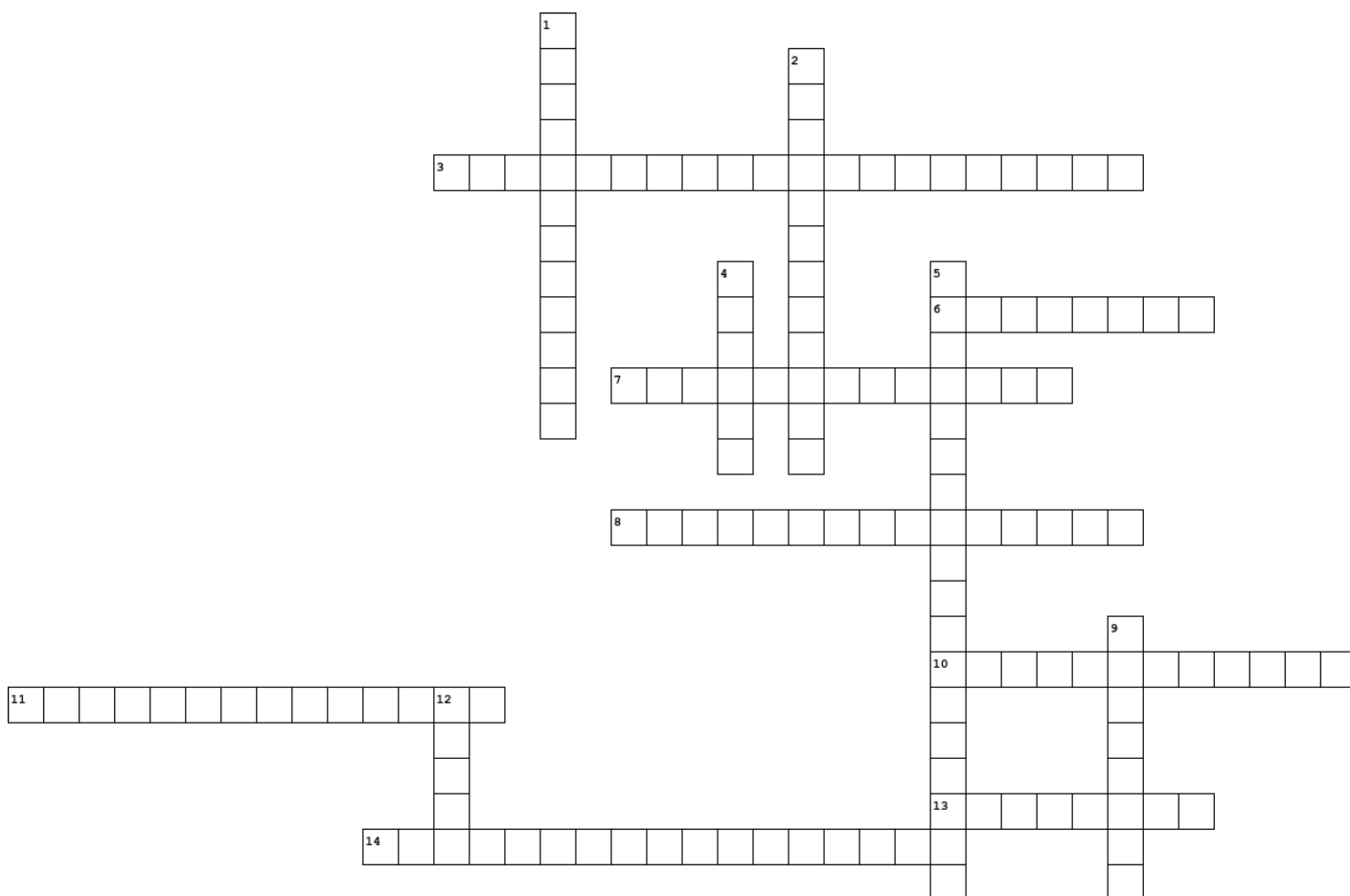

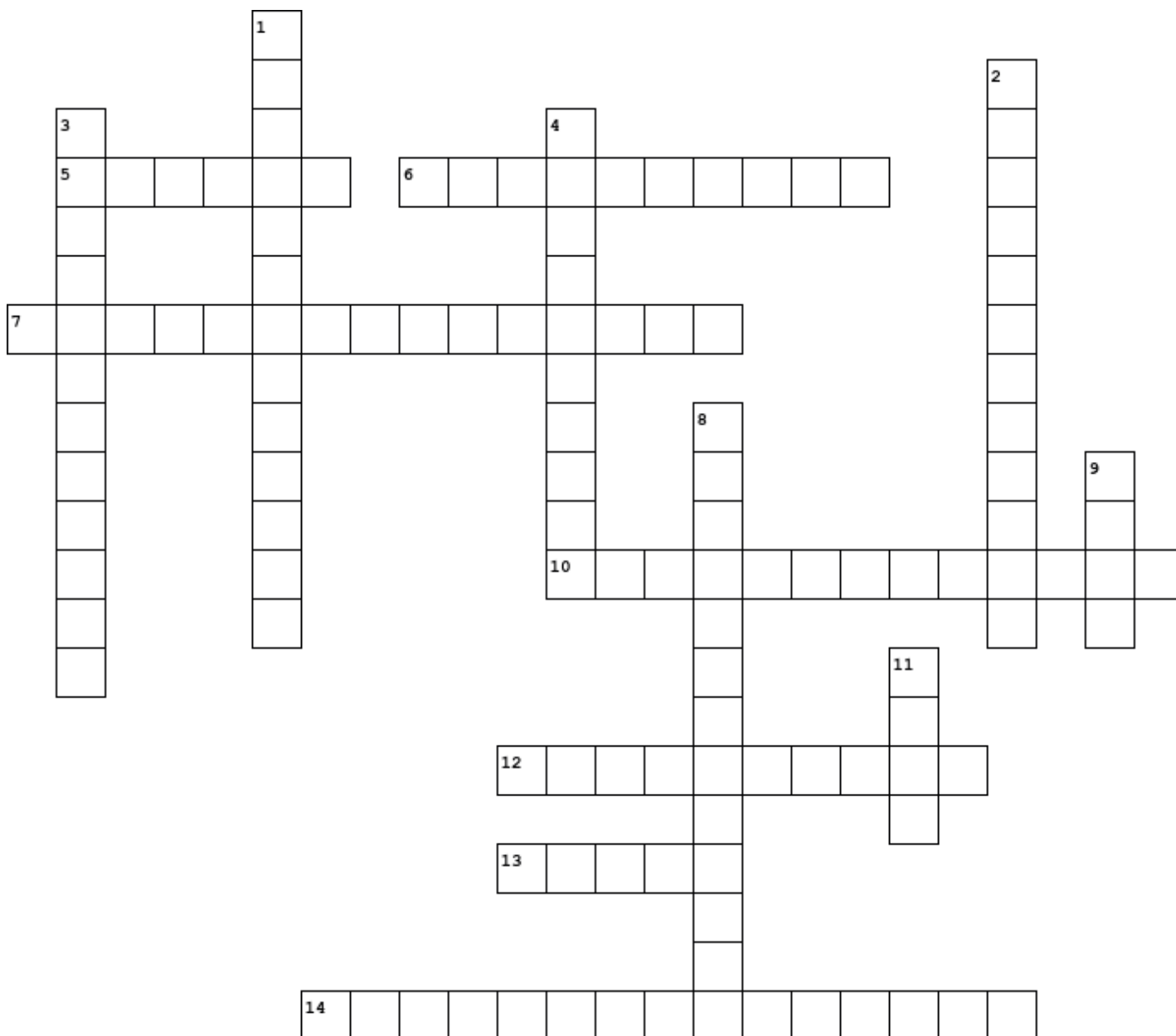

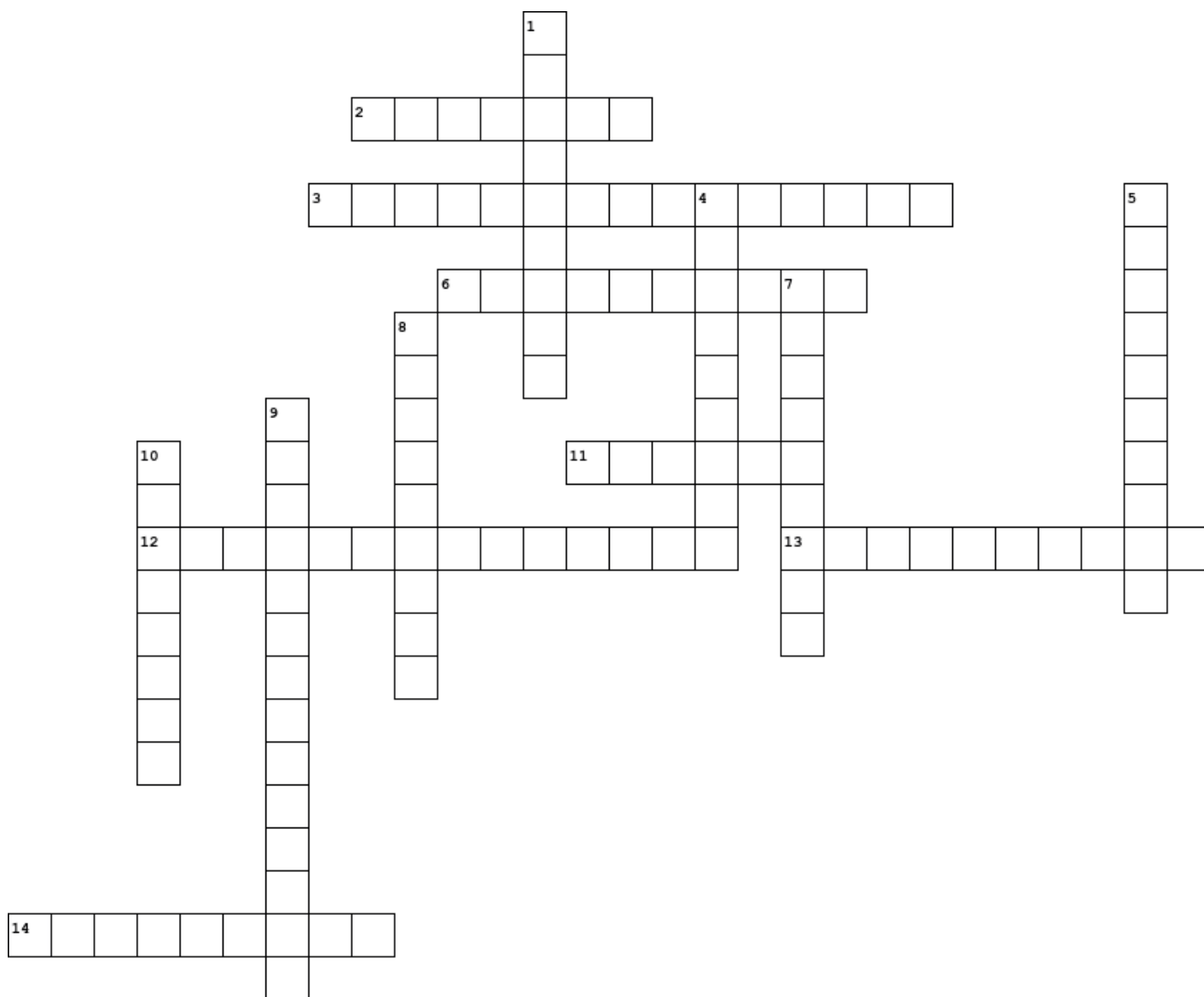
5. Principles or standards of behaviour that distinguish between right and wrong, often influenced by cultural, religious, or personal beliefs.

7. The conduct, aims, or qualities that characterize a professional person; adherence to ethical standards, competence, and appropriate behavior in a professional setting.
10. The degree to which objectives are achieved and the extent to which targeted problems are solved, focusing on the outcomes rather than the means of achieving them.
12. The quality of being untruthful, deceitful, or fraudulent, involving actions or behaviours that intentionally mislead or deceive others.
13. Wrongful or criminal deception intended to result in financial or personal gain, involving deliberate misrepresentation or concealment of information.
14. The obligation to protect sensitive information from unauthorized access or disclosure, ensuring that private data is kept secure and only shared with those who have a legitimate need to know.

1. An individual employed by the government to perform public duties and services, often held to high ethical and professional standards to serve the community effectively.
2. The act of dishonestly withholding or stealing funds or property entrusted to one's care, typically in a professional or fiduciary capacity.
3. The principle of not being biased or influenced by personal feelings, ensuring fair and equal treatment for all parties involved.
4. The act of making information known or public, especially information that was previously confidential or unknown, often required by law or ethical standards.
8. A set of guidelines and expectations that outline acceptable behaviours and responsibilities for individuals within an organization, promoting ethical and professional standards.
9. The possibility of loss, damage, or any other undesirable event occurring due to a particular action or decision, often assessed in terms of probability and impact.
11. A solemn promise or declaration, often invoking a divine witness, regarding one's future actions or behaviour, typically taken in a formal setting.
